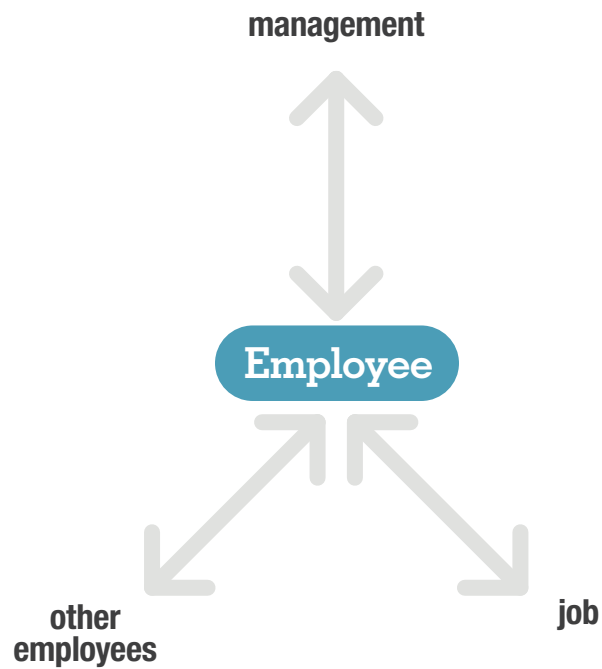


What Relationships Are Important in a Great Workplace?

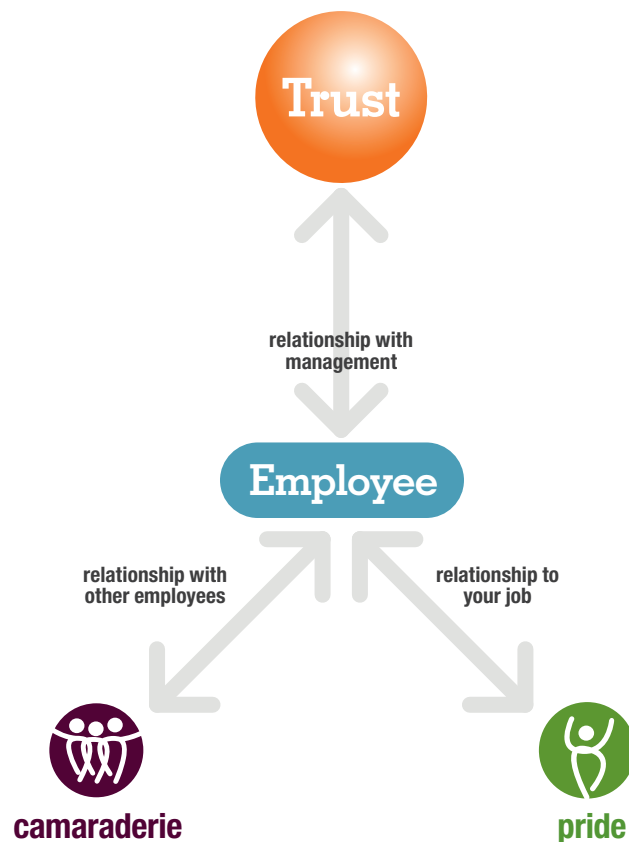
There are three primary relationships that employees have in the workplace: with management, with their job and with other employees.

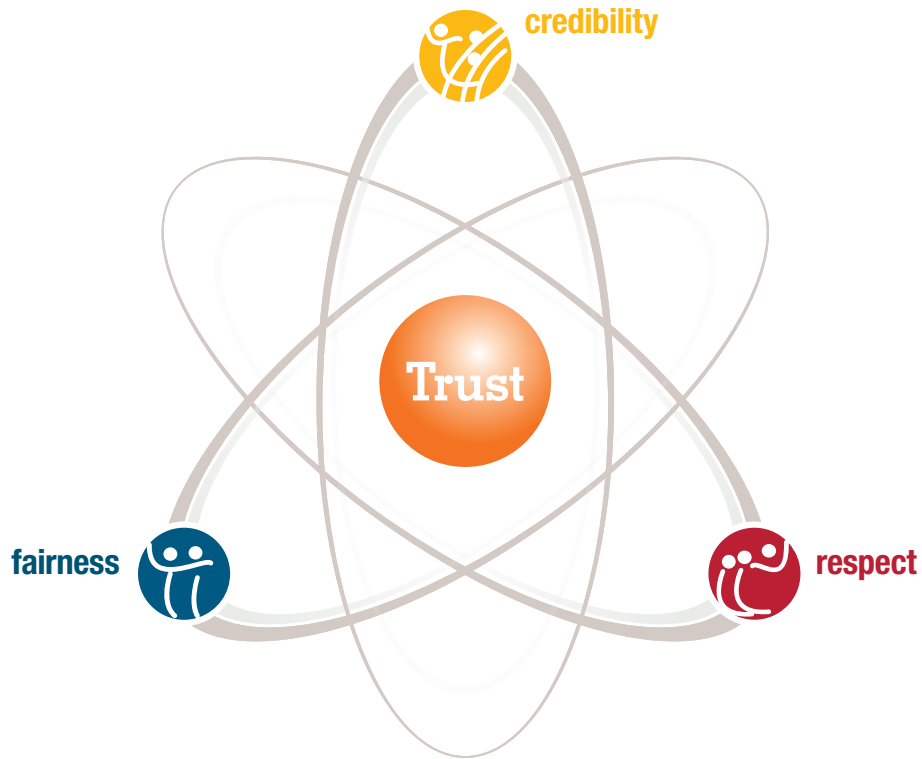

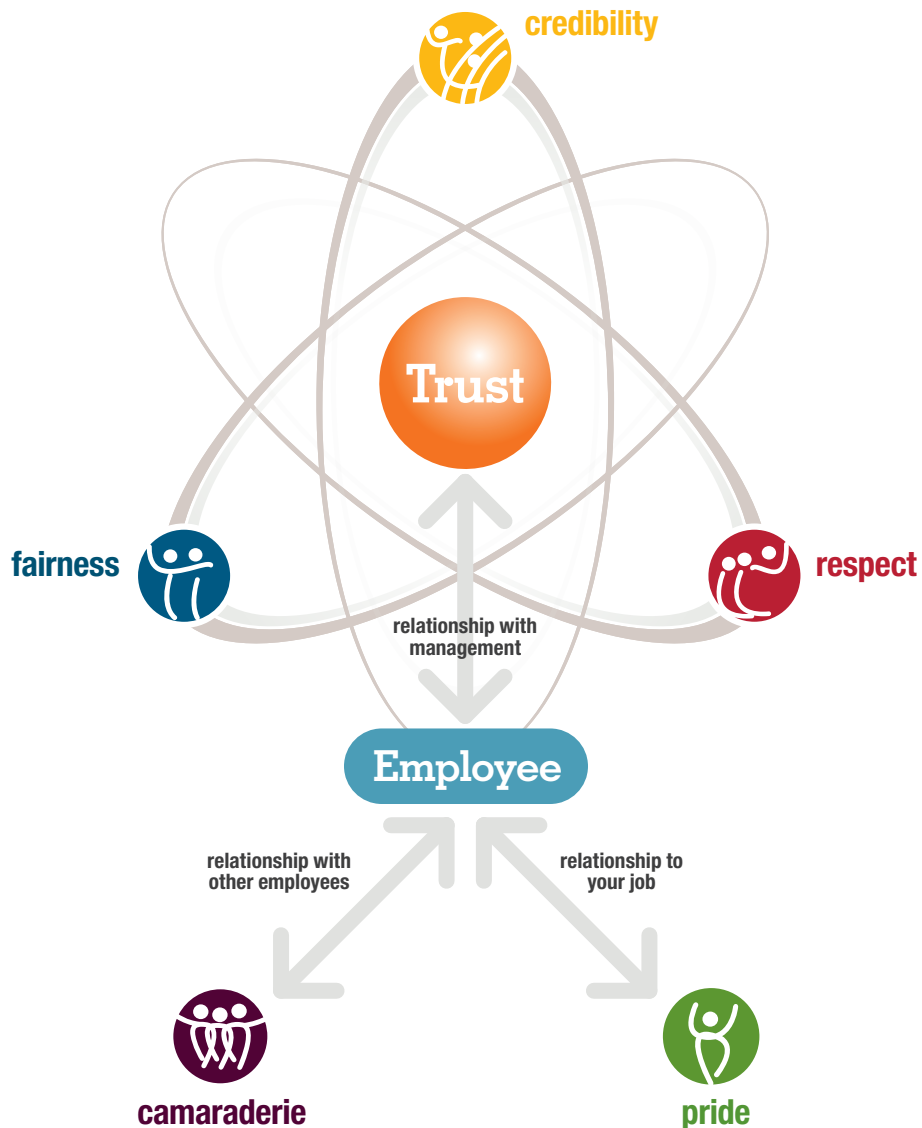
